# RHODE WORKS

### RhodeWorks is the plan by which we live at RIDOT.

- RhodeWorks became law in 2016
- Based on asset management, complete reorganization of RIDOT, strict accountability
- The Ten-Year-Plan is the roadmap
- Asset Management approach to selecting projects is saving \$1B in first 10 years
- No project starts until we identify funding
- Projects done based on their life cycle, not politics





# How does the Ten-Year-Plan Work?


