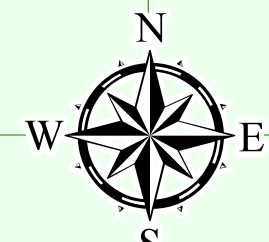

Crossing Rhode Island's Major Bridges by Bicycle

Bicycle Travel PERMITTED

- George Washington Bridge: George Redman Linear Park Connecting Providence to East Bay Bike Path
- Henderson (Red) Bridge: Connecting the East Side of Providence to East Providence
- Mant Hope Bridge: Connecting Bristol and Portsmouth. Experienced riders only. Use EXTREME CAUTION.
- Sakonnet River Bridge: Use bike path on north side of bridge from Anthony Road/Hammocks Avenue in Portsmouth to Evans Avenue in Tiverton.

Bicycle Travel PROHIBITED

- Jamestown/Verrazano Bridge
- Pell (Newport) Bridge

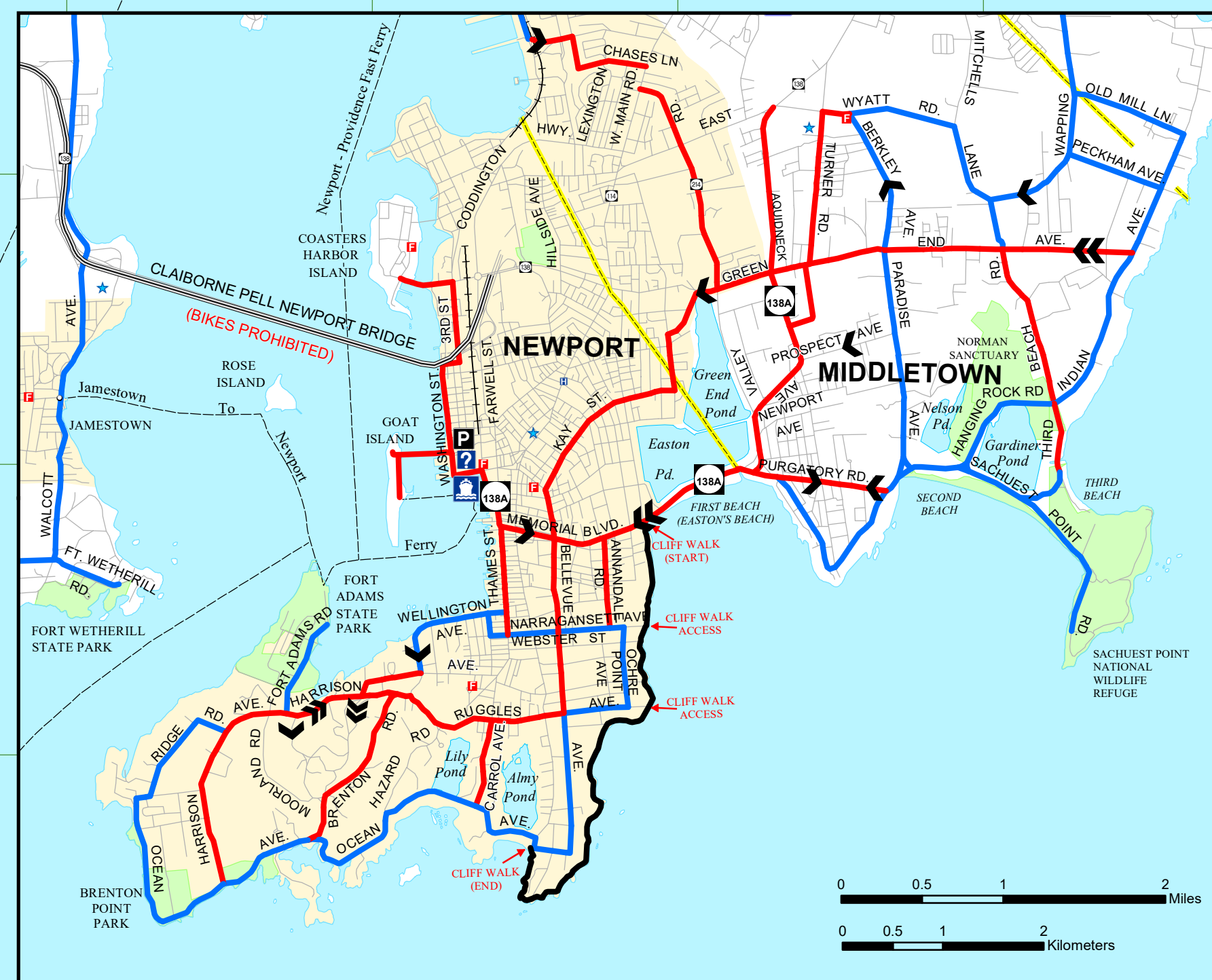
